

ROAD CLOSURES/DELAYS

CLOSURES:

HILL STREET from MacDonnell Street to Napier Street will be closed until mid May for road reconstruction.

HOMEWARD AVENUE from Southwood Drive to MacClement Drive will be closed until the end of May for road reconstruction.

ONTARIO STREET is closed between Queen Street and Brock Street until further notice.

PRINCESS STREET is closed from Wellington Street to its foot below Ontario Street. King Street is closed from Brock Street through the intersection at Princess Street for reconstruction.

SOUTHWOOD DRIVE from Fairleigh Street East to Homeward Avenue will be closed until mid May for road reconstruction.

DELAYS:

CREEKFORD ROAD between Bayridge Drive (future extension) and Cloggs Road will be reduced to one lane until the end of May during the installation of a trunk watermain.

PRINCESS STREET will be reduced to one lane from Collins Bay Road to Westbrook Road until mid July for bridge maintenance.

TAYLOR-KIDD BOULEVARD will be reduced to one lane in each direction between Old Colony Road and Progress Avenue until the end of May because of road widening to accommodate left turn lanes.

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORTATION ROAD WORK:

HIGHWAY 401 EASTBOUND AND WESTBOUND SHOULDERS will be closed for temporary access and egress, maintenance and layout.

HIGHWAY 401 EASTBOUND BETWEEN SYDENHAM ROAD AND DIVISION STREET will be reduced to one lane daily from 8 p.m. to 7 a.m.

HIGHWAY 401 WESTBOUND BETWEEN MONTREAL STREET AND DIVISION STREET will be reduced to one lane daily from 6 p.m. to 7 a.m. for barrier construction and structural work.

HIGHWAY 401 WESTBOUND OFF AND ON RAMP AT DIVISION STREET will be closed daily from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. for structural work.

DIVISION STREET AT HIGHWAY 401 will be reduced to one lane in both directions daily from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. for structural work, granular placement and earth excavation.

SYDENHAM ROAD AT HIGHWAY 401 will be reduced to one lane in both directions daily from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. for excavation and environmental work.

HIGHWAY 401 EASTBOUND OFF RAMP AT SIR JOHN A MACDONALD BOULEVARD will be closed daily from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. for excavation and placement of granular material.

SIR JOHN A. MACDONALD BOULEVARD AT HIGHWAY 401 will be reduced to one lane in both directions daily from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. for guide rail work.

HIGHWAY 401 EASTBOUND will be reduced to one lane between Sydenham Road and Division Street from 6 p.m. to 7 a.m. for excavation, asphalt work, and line painting.

HIGHWAY 401 EASTBOUND ON RAMP AT SIR JOHN A MACDONALD BOULEVARD will be closed from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. for excavation and granular placement.

HIGHWAY 401 EASTBOUND OFF RAMP AT DIVISION STREET will be closed from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. for excavation and granular placement.

OVERNIGHT LANE RESTRICTIONS ON THE LASALLE CAUSEWAY EXTENDED TO JUNE 2010

Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) wishes to advise all local residents that vehicular traffic will experience overnight lane restrictions and closures on the LaSalle Causeway Bascule Lift Bridge in Kingston, Ontario until early June 2010. The bridge will re-open to marine navigation on May 14, 2010.

The LaSalle Causeway will be closed to vehicular traffic overnight from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. on four consecutive nights between May 17 and May 20. Lane restrictions and road closures will allow for structural repair and repainting work to be performed.
