

ROAD CLOSURES/DELAYS

CLOSURES:

- ACADIA DRIVE** (north leg) from Evangeline Avenue to Bayridge Drive will be closed until June 4 for the construction of trunk water main.
- CATARAQUI STREET** from the Cataraqui River to Orchard Street will be closed from June 7 to June 25 for road reconstruction.
- HILL STREET** from MacDonnell Street to Traymoor Street will be closed until mid June.
- JOHN SCOTT ROAD** will be closed at the railway crossing from noon on June 3 to noon on June 4 while CN makes improvements to the crossing.
- ONTARIO STREET** is closed between Queen Street and Brock Street until further notice.
- PRINCESS STREET** is closed from King Street to its foot below Ontario Street until June 30.
- STATION ROAD** will be closed at the railway crossing from noon on June 2 to noon on June 3 while CN makes improvements to the crossing.
- SUNNY ACRES ROAD** from Dale Street to Front Road will be closed until June 4 for trunk water main construction.

DELAYS:

WATER RESTRICTIONS

Odds water only on odd days, evens on even days starting June 15

Starting June 15, residents with odd-numbered addresses can water their yards only on odd numbered days and those with even-numbered addresses can water only on even-numbered days according to Kingston's water use bylaw.

On scheduled watering days, residents must restrict their use of sprinklers to between 5 a.m. and 10 a.m., but other outdoor water can be used anytime throughout their scheduled day with a handheld hose or watering can.

The bylaw, in effect until Sept. 15, ensures that the City maintains its reserve of potable water, maintains water pressure, and has enough water in reserve to fight fires.

Residents who have put in a new yard, trees or shrubs, sod, or who have seeded a new lawn can apply for a \$55 exemption permit to allow them to use a sprinkler on their new lawns for seven consecutive days between 5 a.m. and 10 a.m. The permits are issued by Utilities Kingston at 1211 John Counter Blvd. Existing yards will not be granted exemption permits and only one permit will be granted per property, per year.

Cana Wastewater Treatment Plant Schedule C Class Environmental Assessment Utilities Kingston

Study Background: Utilities Kingston has initiated a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) to evaluate options for the management (i.e. collection, conveyance, and treatment) of sewage from the 32-home Cana community. The location of the existing plant is shown in the figure below. The study is being conducted according to the Municipal Class EA process, and is currently considered a Schedule C undertaking. The treatment capacity of the plant is not being increased as part of this project.

The EA has been implemented to address the infrastructure in the Cana community, since the existing facility and collection system are aging and in need of repair. The existing sewage collection system has been in operation for approximately 50 years and preliminary investigations have revealed that improvements are required. The Cana WWTP was commissioned in 1973 and has not been substantially improved since that time. Given that effluent quality requirements have become increasingly stringent and that the existing plant is in need of repair, this Class EA will seek to provide recommendations for what form improvements to the system should take.

Study Process: The EA is proceeding as a Schedule C undertaking in accordance with the requirements of the Ontario Municipal Class EA. It will involve an assessment of the potential positive or negative social, cultural, economic, and environmental impacts of a number of options

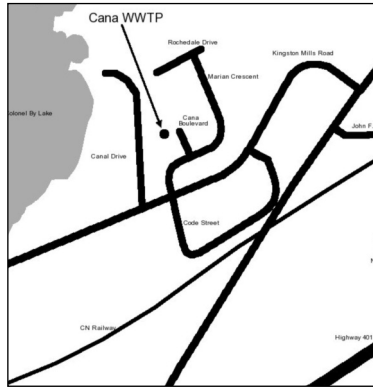

The work is being completed by Fer-Pal Construction Ltd. The rehabilitation work consists of cleaning the inside of the watermains and relining the existing pipes with a structural liner. This method requires minimum excavation – you will see several “access” pits for pipe access.

In order to complete the work, all water services must be disconnected from the existing main. The Contractor will provide temporary water service to all residences and businesses that are affected by this work.

The Contractor will begin mobilizing to your street starting in May to prepare for installing temporary water services. The work is expected to take several weeks after which the Contractor will move on to the next road location within the City of Kingston. Generally, the sequence is as noted above. However, this is subject to change. You will get notices as the work proceeds.

The Denyes Monument is valued because of its physical/designed attributes. The monument is built of local fieldstone in a simple, traditional cairn style with a memorial plaque on the north face of the cairn. The monument is of historical/associative value because it memorializes the sacrifice of Frederick Denyes (a Ministry of Transportation Employee and United Empire Loyalist descendent) and the loss of Kenneth Macrow. The contextual value of the monument stems from its sensitive positioning near the site of the accident and its role as a landmark on Princess Street.

TAKE NOTICE that on May 18, 2010 the Council of The Corporation of the City of Kingston passed By-law 2010-86 under Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18, to update the designation by-law for a property located at Part Lot 17 Concession 1 City of Kingston, Being Parts 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 on Plan 13R 13R 19655, Being Part of PIN 36004-0397 (R) (also known as 889 King Street West & 100 Portsmouth Avenue) to reflect its cultural heritage value and interest.

Newcourt House and its associated root cellar, located at 889 King Street West (also known as 100 Portsmouth Avenue), are of cultural heritage value and interest because of their combined physical/design features, their historical associations, and their contextual value. They are located on the St. Lawrence College campus, northeast of the intersection of Portsmouth Avenue and Country Club Drive. The design/physical value of Newcourt House derives from the fact that it is a Regency-style villa featuring a dominant front verandah, ample fenestration, a low-hipped roof above low and wide one-storey massing, and a roughcast exterior. The building has two large interior rooms with original plaster walls, partially-vaulted ceilings and inset, arched doorways, along with interior casings on the front windows. The physical value of the property is enhanced by a rare, partially-sunken, brick root cellar which is located behind the villa. Newcourt possesses historical value through its association with local and provincial persons and institutions, including the Honourable Hamilton Killaly; prominent local merchant, William Wilson, and the Ontario Psychiatric Hospital. Newcourt is a local landmark on King Street West that retains some elements of its original country setting.

Municipal Election Compliance Audit Committee (3 Members)

Pursuant to the Municipal Elections Act, 1996, an eligible elector who believes on reasonable grounds that a candidate has contravened provisions of the Act, related to election finance, may apply for a compliance audit of the candidate's election finances. The Committee is responsible for considering all applications for compliance audits received relating to election campaign finances for the 2010 municipal election and any by-election during Council's term, and for deciding whether the application should be granted or rejected. The powers and functions of the Committee are set out in sections 81 and 81.1 of the Act.

Membership will be drawn from following groups:

- Accounting and audit
- Academic
- Legal
- Other individuals with knowledge of the campaign financing rules of the Act.

Members will be selected on the basis of the following:

- Demonstrated knowledge and understanding of municipal election campaign finance rules
- Proven analytical and decision-making skills
- Experience working on a committee, task force, or similar setting
- Availability and willingness to attend meetings
- Excellent oral or written communication skills.

Note: To avoid conflict of interest, any individual appointed to the Committee must agree in writing not to undertake audits or preparation of the financial statements to any candidates seeking election in 2010. Failure to adhere to this requirement, will result in the individual being removed from the Committee.

Members must not be employees or officers of the municipality or local board, members of Council, or local board or any person who are candidates in the 2010 municipal election.

The Committee Appointment terms are until Nov. 30, 2014.

All meetings will be conducted in a manner consistent with the Municipal Act and Procedural Bylaw.

To be eligible to serve on a City of Kingston Board or Committee, you must qualify as a municipal elector by meeting the following qualifications:

- a resident of the municipality, a non-resident owner or tenant of land in the municipality or the spouse of such non-resident owner or tenant;
- a Canadian citizen;
- at least 18 years old;
- not legally prohibited from voting; and
- not disqualified by any legislation from holding municipal office.
