

ROAD CLOSURES/DELAYS

CLOSURES:

BARRIE STREET will be closed between Johnson and William Streets until late July because of road reconstruction.

BARRIE STREET will also be closed between Brock and Princess Streets until late July because of road reconstruction.

CATARAQUI STREET from Orchard Street to Rideau Street will be closed until mid July for road reconstruction.

MACDONNELL STREET will be closed from Hill Street to Earl Street beginning July 14 until mid-August.

MACK STREET will be closed from Albert Street to Nelson Street for road reconstruction until late July.

WILLINGDON AVENUE from Hill Street to Earl Street will be closed until late July.

DELAYS:

BAYRIDGE DRIVE will experience traffic delays between Front Road and Cataraqui Woods Drive until October for trunk watermain construction.

FRONT ROAD in the vicinity of Sunny Acres Road and Bayridge Drive will be reduced to one lane in each direction until October for trunk watermain work.

Expect traffic delays on **GARDINERS ROAD** in the vicinity of Golden Mile Road until the end of July while crews for a local development install left turn lanes and traffic signals.

JOHN COUNTER BOULEVARD will be reduced to one lane and experience delays in the vicinity of the CN Rail crossing on July 14 while crews make improvements to the crossing.

JOHNSON STREET at Division Street will experience traffic delays until mid July while crews for Kingston Hydro install cables.

Expect delays at **PRINCESS STREET** from Collins Bay Road to Westbrook Road until mid July for bridge maintenance.

HERITAGE COMMITTEE MEETING

Kingston Municipal Heritage Committee Public Consultation Meeting

The Kingston Municipal Heritage Committee will be hosting a public consultation meeting in order to receive public input regarding an 'Application for Alteration Under the Ontario Heritage Act' (OHA) to a property designated under the OHA, located at 390 King St. W., and also known as the Stella Buck Building. This proposed alteration concerns the construction of the new Queen's University Performing Arts Centre.

The Applicant, Queen's University, is proposing to construct a new Performing Arts Centre that incorporates the adaptive reuse of the two stone structures known as the Stella Buck and the Stable Buildings into a complex with a gross floor area of approximately 84,000 square feet.

Public Consultation

Anyone may attend the public consultation meeting and make a verbal statement, and/or submit comments in writing. The Kingston Municipal Heritage Committee will be holding the public consultation meeting at which a representative for the Applicant will be making a presentation with respect to the proposed development and alterations for the property. Following the Applicant's presentation, there will be an opportunity for the public to ask questions of the Applicant.

Please note that City Council has delegated to the Kingston Municipal Heritage Committee the authority to hold the public consultation meeting instead of Council. All representations, both verbal and written, will be considered by the Heritage Committee, which will make its recommendations (at a future regularly scheduled meeting) to Council for a decision on the matter.
