

ROAD CLOSURES/DELAYS

CLOSURES:

BARRIE STREET will be closed between Johnson and William Streets until early August because of road reconstruction.

BARRIE STREET will also be closed from Brock to Johnson Streets until mid August because of road reconstruction.

CATARAQUI STREET from Orchard Street to Rideau Street will be closed until early August for road reconstruction.

MACDONNELL STREET will be closed from Hill Street to Earl Street until mid August.

MACK STREET will be closed from Nelson Street to Victoria Street for road reconstruction until early August.

DELAYS:

BAYRIDGE DRIVE will experience traffic delays between Front Road and Cataraqui Woods Drive until October for trunk watermain construction.

FRONT ROAD in the vicinity of Sunny Acres Road and Bayridge Drive will be reduced to one lane in each direction until October for trunk watermain work.

Expect delays on **GARDINERS ROAD** from south of Princess Street to Cataraqui Woods Drive from Aug. 3 to the end of September while crews for a local development install left turn lanes, street lights and traffic signals.

Expect traffic delays on **GARDINERS ROAD** in the vicinity of Golden Mile Road until the end of July while crews for a local development install left turn lanes and traffic signals.

Expect delays on **HIGHWAY 2** from Sibbit Avenue to Deer Ridge Drive until early September for road resurfacing.

Expect delays on **HIGHWAY 15** from Craftsman Boulevard to Highway 2 until early September for road resurfacing.

Expect delays at **PRINCESS STREET** from Collins Bay Road to Westbrook Road until the end of July for bridge maintenance.

EVENT CLOSURES

PRINCESS STREET will be closed to vehicular traffic from Division Street to Ontario Street from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. on July 31 for the car-free Princess Street Promenade. Cross streets remain open to vehicular traffic. For transit detours and accessible parking options go to www.cityofkingston.ca/transit and www.cityofkingston.ca/accessibility.

MARKET STREET will be closed every Saturday and Sunday until Oct. 24 to accommodate the Kingston Public Market.

K-TOWN TRIATHLON, Sunday, Aug. 1. Streets affected by the event are:
The LaSalle Causeway will be reduced to a single centre lane for vehicular traffic (controlled by traffic signals) and two outside lanes for cyclists from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Ontario Street between Brock and Market Streets is closed from 4 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Princess Street between King Street and the Holiday Inn; **Ontario Street** between Queen and Brock Streets; **Brock Street** between King and Ontario Streets are all closed from 4 a.m. to 12:45 p.m.

Ontario Street between Market and West Streets; **Market Street, Clarence Street, Johnson Street, William Street, Earl Street, Gore Street, Lower Union Street and West Street** between King Street and Ontario Street are all closed from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Ontario Street between Barrack and Queen Street; **Queen Street** between King Street and Ontario Street; **Place d'Armes** southbound ramp from King Street to Ontario Street; **Ontario Street** southbound lane between the northerly leg of Place d'Armes and Barrack Street are all closed from 7:30 a.m. to 12:45 p.m.

Temporary change to a two-way traffic pattern between

Princess Street between King and Ontario Streets from 7:30 a.m. to 12:45 p.m. and **Brock Street** between King and Ontario Streets from 4 a.m. to 12:45 p.m.

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORTATION ROAD WORK:

HIGHWAY 401 EASTBOUND AND WESTBOUND SHOULDERS will be closed for temporary access and egress, maintenance and layout until July 30.

DIVISION STREET will be reduced to one lane in both directions 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. until July 30.

SYDENHAM ROAD will be reduced to one lane 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. until July 30.

HIGHWAY 401 EASTBOUND AND WESTBOUND AT SYDENHAM ROAD will be reduced to one lane from 6 p.m. to 7 a.m. from July 27 to July 30.

HIGHWAY 401 WESTBOUND OFF RAMP AT SIR JOHN A. MACDONALD BOULEVARD will be closed until July 27.

HIGHWAY 401 EASTBOUND FROM DIVISION STREET TO MONTREAL STREET will be reduced to one lane 6 p.m. to 7 a.m. until July 28.

HIGHWAY 401 WESTBOUND OFF RAMP AT DIVISION STREET will be closed from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. until July 30.

HIGHWAY 401 WESTBOUND FROM DIVISION STREET TO SYDENHAM ROAD will be reduced to one lane from 6 p.m. to 7 a.m. until July 29.

PARKING GARAGE REPAIRS

Work continues on City parking garages

Parking in the downtown area is affected by construction work to rehabilitate three downtown municipal parking lots. This long-planned work is necessary to maintain the integrity of these parking structures.

The **Upper and Bruce Memorial** lots – off Montreal or Bagot Streets near Brock Street – remain CLOSED until the end of July to accommodate work.

Work on the **Chown** Parking Garage – off Brock Street above Montreal Street – continues until November with limited spaces available for parking.

Hanson Garage – off Brock Street near Wellington Street – REMAINS OPEN. Work begins in August and will continue until November with limited spaces available for parking.

CAR-FREE PRINCESS STREET PROMENADE

The City invites Kingstontians to celebrate active transportation by taking a stroll down the middle of a car-free Princess Street during the Princess Street Promenade on Saturday, July 31 between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.

Princess Street will be closed to vehicular traffic from Division Street to Ontario Street from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. – but will be open to anyone using an “active” form of transportation – that is, those using their bodies to get around instead of a car.

A number of storefront activities are offered along the stroll by downtown businesses and community organizations and will give the event a street-festival feel. See www.princessstreetpromenade.ca for a complete listing of activities.

Kingston Transit buses will be detoured around Princess Street, so those heading downtown are encouraged to plan to get there by bus (considered a form of active transportation) using the Kingston Transit My Trip Planner at www.cityofkingston.ca/triplanner.

Cross streets will be open to vehicular traffic during the Promenade. Vehicles left parked on Princess Street on July 31 will be towed. Alternative accessible parking spaces are being set up for the occasion near the corners of all streets crossing Princess. SHEEP DOG TRIALS: AUG. 6 – 8

Don't miss the 23rd Sheep Dog Trials – Canada's largest border collie sheep-herding championships – which run from **8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Aug. 6 to 8 at Grass Creek Park** (between Kingston and Gananoque at 2991 Hwy. 2). Once again the family-friendly trials have been named an Ontario Top 100 Event. Admission is \$10 a day or \$25 for a three-day pass. **Kids 10 and under get in free.**

In addition to the dog versus sheep herding action, this year's three-day event will also feature the 1000 Island Dock Dogs; the Birds of Prey Show; Young Sheep Dog Training demos; sheep shearing demonstrations; the Sheep to Shawl competition; Spinning and Weaving demos by Kingston Spinners & Weavers Guild; a shawl auction; the Craft & Artisan Fair; the Kingston Police K-9 Unit; face-painting; the Success-by-Six Play Corner; crafts, postcard and mural-making; pony rides and a petting zoo.

There's plenty of on-site parking (including accessible parking), accessible washrooms, and food vendors will be offering BBQ, baked goods, kettle corn and cotton candy.
