

ROAD CLOSURES/DELAYS

CLOSURES:

BARRIE STREET will be closed between Johnson and William Streets until mid August because of road reconstruction.

BARRIE STREET will also be closed from Brock to Johnson Streets until mid August because of road reconstruction.

CATARAQUI STREET from Orchard Street to Rideau Street will be closed until mid August for road reconstruction.

JOYCEVILLE ROAD will be closed from 4th Concession Road to Woodburn Road from Aug. 9 to Aug. 23 because of culvert replacement.

MACDONNELL STREET will be closed from Hill Street to Earl Street until mid August.

MACK STREET will be closed from Nelson Street to Victoria Street for road reconstruction until mid August.

MACK STREET will be closed from Victoria Street to Toronto Street from Aug. 4 to Aug. 17 for road reconstruction.

RIDEAU STREET will be closed from Cataraqui Street to James Street from Aug. 9 to Aug. 20 for road reconstruction.

DELAYS:

BAYRIDGE DRIVE will experience traffic delays between Front Road and Cataraqui Woods Drive until October for trunk watermain construction.

FRONT ROAD in the vicinity of Sunny Acres Road and Bayridge Drive will be reduced to one lane in each direction until October for trunk watermain work.

Expect delays on **GARDINERS ROAD** from south of Princess Street to Cataraqui Woods Drive until the end of September while crews for a local development install left turn lanes, street lights and traffic signals.

Expect delays on **HIGHWAY 15** from Craftsman Boulevard to Highway 2 until early September for road resurfacing.

Expect delays at **PRINCESS STREET** from Collins Bay Road to Westbrook Road until mid August for bridge maintenance.

PARKING GARAGE REPAIRS

Work continues on City parking garages

Parking in the downtown area is affected by construction work to rehabilitate three downtown municipal parking lots. This long-planned work is necessary to maintain the integrity of these parking structures.

The **Upper Robert Bruce** Parking Garage on Montreal Street is available to permit holders only on weekdays and hourly parkers evenings and weekends until the end of November.

The **Lower Robert Bruce** Parking Garage on Bagot Street is closed until mid August.

Work on the **Chown** Parking Garage – off Brock Street above Montreal Street – continues until November with limited spaces available for parking.

Hanson Garage – off Brock Street near Wellington Street – REMAINS OPEN. Work begins in August and will continue until November with reduced spaces available for parking.

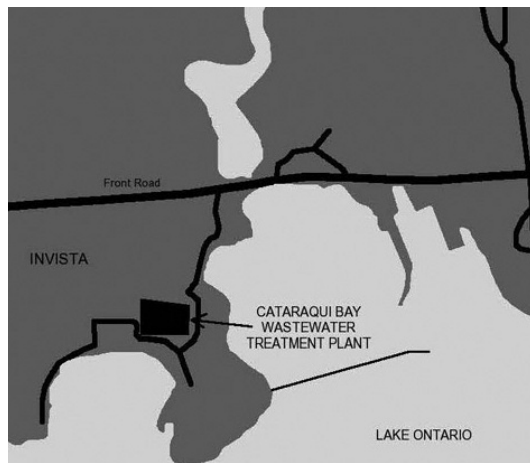

CATARAQUI BAY WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT Schedule C Class Environmental Assessment

Utilities Kingston has initiated a Class Environmental Assessment (EA) to upgrade the facility and expand the treatment capacity at the Cataraqui Bay Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) in order to ensure continued reliable service. The purpose of this EA study is to identify the preferred strategy for meeting future wastewater treatment needs identified through the Sewer Master Plan currently underway. The Cataraqui Bay WWTP, located at 409 Front Road, provides treatment of wastewater generated in Kingston's west end and currently has a rated capacity of 38 800 m³/d. This EA study will examine alternative strategies for an increase in the functional capacity of the WWTP in order to accommodate anticipated future flow requirements.

The study is being conducted in accordance with the requirements of a Schedule C project under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (October 2000, as amended in 2007). The Class EA process involves identification of effluent and capacity requirements, assessment of alternative optimization and expansion strategies, development of a recommended conceptual design, and consultation with agencies and the public. The alternative strategies will be evaluated to ensure the preferred solution minimizes impacts on the natural and social/cultural environment while optimizing capital and operating investments.



Public and agency consultation is a key element of the Class EA process, and input will be sought throughout the study.
