Public meeting to discuss designing Breakwater Park for active living

Breakwater Park – the park that runs along the waterfront between Beverley and Barrie streets – will be the focus of an upcoming public meeting on how to enhance this great public space to further encourage active living.

The workshop-style meeting, to be run by active transportation expert Gil Penalosa of 8-80 Cities, is set for 7 p.m. on Thursday, Feb. 16 at Memorial Hall, City Hall, 216 Ontario St. Participants are asked to register by 6:45 p.m.

8-80 Cities is a design firm that is partnering with the Ministry of Health to offer a grant to create spaces that invite physical activity and incorporate sustainable design principles. The City and KFL&A Public Health partnered on the application and became one of just six municipalities to receive a "Make a Place for People" grant of \$25,000 toward developing improvements to Breakwater Park.

 - Guidelines to provide the City of Kingston direction for support of other national and international commemorative events in preparation for a number of upcoming anniversaries

Williamsville Main Street study to be presented to public and Planning Committee

The findings and recommendations of the Williamsville Main Street Study will be presented at a public open house at 3 p.m., Thursday, Feb. 2 in Memorial Hall, City Hall, 216 Ontario St. Later that same evening, the Study goes to the City's Planning Committee at its regular meeting at 6:30 p.m. in City Hall's Council Chambers.

The Williamsville Main Street Study, prepared for the City by consultants Brook McIlroy Inc., will also be available for viewing along with supporting technical information at www.CityofKingston.ca/williamsville on Thursday, Jan. 26.

Williamsville's "Main Street" is the 1.7 km stretch of Princess Street between Division Street and Bath Road/Concession Street. It's an area of town that now has more than its share of vacant lots and is ripe for revitalization.

The Williamsville Main Street Study is the culmination of a year-long process that has involved residents and stakeholders in a series of open houses and workshops in shaping this Study aimed at bringing new life to this central area of town.

The City is considering these improvements to John Machin Sports Fields Park:

- an artificial turf soccer field with sports lighting
- a permanent park washroom building
- a provision for a potential future seasonal air-supported dome for indoor sport

Residents are invited to discuss these proposed improvements at a meeting set for 7 p.m., Wednesday, Feb. 15 at the Little Theatre room at La Salle Secondary School, 773 Highway 15.

The 13.5-hectare park at Innovation Drive and Highway 15 has two newly-constructed international regulation-sized soccer fields as well as a variety of sports fields that allow the City to accommodate users of all ages.

John Machin Sports Fields Park also connects to the four kilometre Greenwood Park trail and has a newly-paved parking lot and access road.

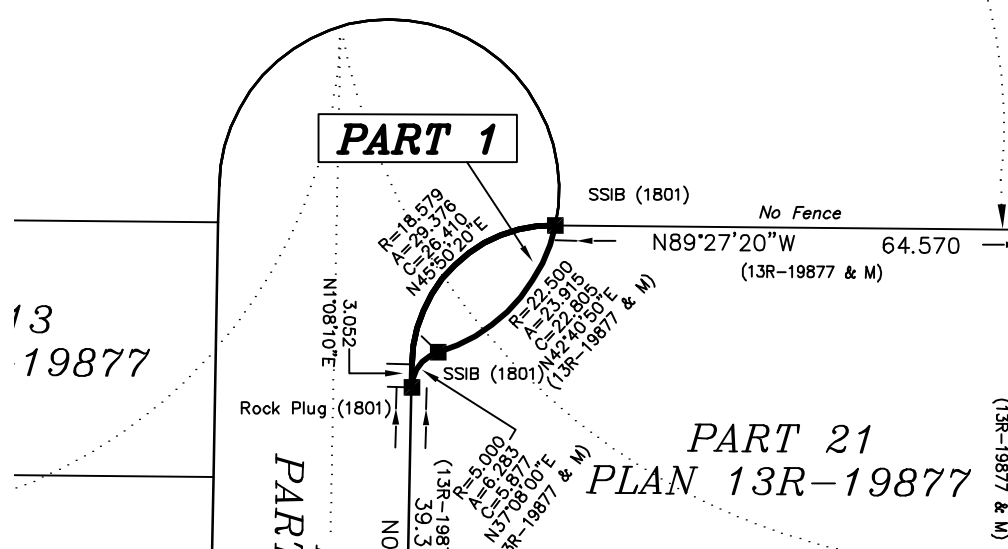
