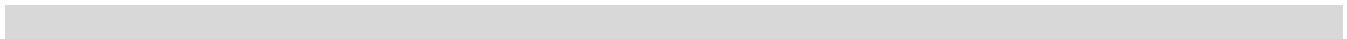

a) **Options to Implement an Organic Source Separated Waste System**

1. **THAT** responses to a Request for Proposals for organics transportation and processing only be accepted from firms that are able to accept organics upon award by having an approved site or by guaranteeing an alternative processing location in the interim while their facility is being approved and constructed; and,
2. **THAT** the RFP allow the use of the Kingston East landfill as a site for processing organics but include the requirement for the successful bidder to remove any infrastructure at the end of the term upon direction by the City; and,
3. **THAT** organics be collected using City staff and that City staff collect the remainder of recycling in Central Kingston; and,
4. **THAT** organics and garbage be collected every week; and,
5. **THAT** carts with automatic tippers be used; and,
6. **THAT** plastic bags not be allowed for placing organics out for collection at this time; and,
7. **THAT** pet waste, kitty litter, diapers and feminine hygiene products not be allowed in the organics waste system at this time; and,
8. **THAT** organics collection be provided for residential properties up to six-units at this time; and,
9. **THAT** financial, social and environmental impacts will be considered when evaluating responses to the RFP for organics transportation and processing. Weighting for each criterion shall be brought to the EITP Committee for consideration.

b) **Use of Paper Bags for Collecting Leaf and Yard Waste**

**THAT** the use of plastic bags be discontinued for placing leaf and yard waste out for collection effective Fall 2007;

**THAT** only kraft paper bags or rigid open-top containers be permitted;

- and further -

**THAT** sample bags be purchased in 2007 from Bag to Earth Inc. with one bag distributed to each household in buildings of six units or less;

- To delete item 3: 'Install designated Cycling Facility on Ontario Street from West Street to Place d'Armes';
- To add under 11 'and consider designated motorcycle parking' to read 'review parking by-law minimum parking standards and cash-in-lieu of parking for commercial uses in the downtown core, and consider designated motorcycle parking'.

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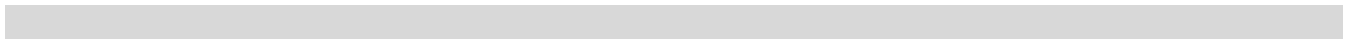

***WHEREAS** the youth of our City, as well as adults, need more exercise and street hockey is a great way of community building;*

***THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the by-law prohibiting street sports on City streets, be sent to the Arts, Recreation and Community Policies Committee for further review including how other municipalities are dealing with these issues, with the aim of opening up safe streets to the possibility of allowing street sports to take place, pending staff and public input;*

*- and further -*

***THAT** the Arts, Recreation and Community Policies Committee investigate other by-laws that may actually work to prevent exercise on our City streets and sidewalks, and together with staff and public input, examine them with the aim of changing to safe yet more open solutions;*

*- and further -*

***THAT** Kingston, the First Capital of Canada, send our warmest regards and best wishes to our current Capital's Ottawa Senators, Canada's best team, and greatest hope in 2007, of doing our nation proud and bringing Lord Stanley's Cup home where it belongs! Go SENS GO! , and,*

**WHEREAS** the Arts, Recreation and Community Policies Committee considered the appropriateness of their review and determined that it would be more appropriately dealt with by Administrative Policies Committee;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the above motion of Council be amended to delete the reference to the Arts, Recreation and Community Policies Committee, and that Council refer the above resolution to the Administrative Policies Committee for their consideration.



## INFORMATION REPORTS

### MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS

Motions of Council are required:

- (1) At the Council meeting held on May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2007, Council adopted the Kingston Arts Council's business plan to administer the City of Kingston's 2007 Arts Fund on behalf of the City of Kingston, which will be administered through a Kingston Arts Council (KAC) Grants Committee. The composition of the Committee is as follows:

*"d. Membership, other than the Chair, will be as follows:*

*At least five representatives of the arts community appointed by the KAC board (to be known as the "arts representatives") and, in accordance with practices of other municipalities, City Councillor(s) and/or staff, who will bring the broader community perspective to deliberations.
