SUBJECT: APPLICATION FOR TILE DRAINAGE LOAN UNDER TILE DRAINAGE ACT – NORMAN KENDALL AND KRISTIE KENDALL

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

An application for a loan under the Tile Drainage Act has been received from Norman Kendall and Kristie Kendall, 2689 Concession 6 Road, Joyceville, Ontario, K0H 1Y0, in the amount of \$15,000 for the installation of a tile drainage system on the property located at Northeast Part Lot 21 and Northwest Part Lot 22, Concession 5, in the former Township of Pittsburg, now known as the City of Kingston, to improve agricultural land. Currently, all property taxes levied on the respective property have been paid.

In 2005 By-law No. 2005-280, "A By-law to Raise \$150,000 to Aid in the Construction of Drainage Works under the Tile Drainage Act, R.S.O. 1990" was passed and the City of Kingston applied for and received approval for funds totaling \$150,000 under the Tile Drainage Act. To date the city has expended \$59,400, leaving a balance of \$90,600 on this by-law for future tile drainage loan applications.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the application for the loan by Norman Kendall and Kristie Kendall under the Tile Drainage Act, in the amount up to \$15,000, be approved, with the understanding that funds shall be provided through a Tile Drainage Debenture with the Province of Ontario, subject to the availability of funding from the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food and Rural Affairs (OMAFRA).
