a) Municipal Council Blanket Support Resolution for Rooftop and Non-Rooftop Solar Photovoltaic Applications of less than 500 Kilowatts Made Under the Provincial Feed-in Tariff Program 3.1

That the following municipal council blanket support resolution for small solar photovoltaic applications made under the Provincial Feed-in Tariff (FIT 3.1) program, be adopted:

Whereas capitalized terms not defined herein have the meanings ascribed to them in the FIT Contract, Version 3.1; and

Whereas the Province's FIT Program encourages the construction and operation of ground mount solar PV and rooftop solar PV generation projects (the "Projects"); and

Whereas one or more Projects may be subject to FIT Contracts and may be constructed and operated in the City of Kingston; and

Whereas in accordance with the FIT Rules, Version 3.0, the Council of the Local Municipality ("Council") had previously indicated, by a resolution, its support for Projects in the Local Municipality (the "Prior Resolution"); and

Whereas Council now indicates, by a resolution dated no earlier than June 10, 2015, Council's continued support for the construction and operation of the Projects anywhere in the Local Municipality (the "New Resolution"); and

Whereas pursuant to the FIT Contract, where a New Resolution is received in respect of the Projects in the Local Municipality, Suppliers will be recognized as fulfilling the requirements under Section 2.4(d)(vii) of the FIT Contract, which may result in Suppliers being offered Notice to Proceed in accordance with the terms of their respective FIT Contract(s);

Therefore Be It Resolved That:

Council of the City of Kingston supports the construction and operation of the Projects anywhere in the City of Kingston.

This resolution's sole purpose is to enable Suppliers to achieve Notice to Proceed under their FIT Contracts and may not be used for the purpose of any other form of municipal approval in relation to a FIT Contract or Project or for any other purpose.

This resolution shall expire twelve (12) months after its adoption by Council.

That staff provides a report to Council upon completion of the preliminary design and financial plan that summarizes the work completed on these two phases of the Third Crossing Action Plan, and provides the budget requirements to complete the final phase of the Third Crossing Action Plan.

2. Non-Statutory Citizen Advisory Committee Review

1. **That** the Kingston Environmental Advisory Forum (KEAF) be retained in its current form pending completion of the KEAF Strategic Planning Session in 2015 at which KEAF shall address the following questions:
 - a) How can KEAF best support the environmental objectives contained within the Sustainable Kingston Plan, the Kingston Strategic Plan and Council's priorities?
 - b) Given the quantity of items historically directed to KEAF for its consideration, would it be more effective for KEAF to meet quarterly rather than monthly?
 - c) Given the emergence of environmental strategy within the Sustainable Kingston Plan and within the municipal Environmental Management System, should KEAF's mandate be adjusted to advise on environmental matters of strategic importance rather than on the development of an environmental strategy?
 - d) Given that since 2000 the municipality has acquired significantly more in-house environmental expertise, should KEAF's structure/composition continue to be one of technical representatives combined with members of the general public, or would a composition of interested public members only be more effective?

and, that following completion of the Strategic Planning Session, staff shall prepare a report to Council that summarizes the results of the Strategic Planning Session and that presents recommendations respecting changes to KEAF's mandate and/or composition and that sets out KEAF's proposed focus areas for 2015 – 2016 that are aligned with Council's priorities.

2. **That** the Kingston Entitlement Access Program (KEAP) Committee be hereby dissolved.
3. **That** the Kingston Memorial Centre Advisory Committee be hereby dissolved.
4. **That** the Near Campus Neighbourhoods Advisory Committee be hereby dissolved.
5. **That** the Museums and Collections Advisory Committee (MACAC) be merged with the Municipal Heritage Committee (MHC) and that the MACAC be hereby dissolved effective November 30, 2015.
6. **That** the necessary by-law to amend By-law No. 2010-205, as amended, "A By-law to Define the Mandate and Meeting Procedures for Committees Established by the Corporation of the City of Kingston" be presented to Council for consideration and be given three readings at the same meeting as follows:
 - a) **Add** a new definition for "Advisory Committee" to Section 1. under the heading Definitions, in accordance with the Draft By-law attached as Exhibit A.
 - b) **Amend** the definition for Ad Hoc Committee in Section 1 by changing the heading to "Special Purpose (Ad Hoc) Committee".
 - c) **Amend** the definition for Sub-Committee in Section 1 so that it includes references to working groups.
 - d) **Add** a policy with respect to creating a committee, amending an existing committee and/or its mandate and dissolving an existing committee and requiring the submission of an Annual Report as a new Section 2., in accordance with the Draft By-law attached as Exhibit A.
 - e) **Re-number** the existing Section 2. to Section 3. and **Re-number** the subsequent sections and sub-sections accordingly.
 - f) **Amend** the re-numbered Section 3.3 to include a reference to working groups.
 - g) **Add** a new re-numbered Section 11 that contains the provisions with respect to Special Purpose (Ad Hoc) Committees.
 - h) **Delete** Schedule B-7 respecting the Kingston Entitlement Access Program (KEAP) Committee in its entirety.

- i) **Delete** Schedule B-14 respecting the Museums and Collections Advisory Committee in its entirety.
- j) **Delete** Schedule F-5 respecting the Kingston Memorial Centre Advisory Committee in its entirety.
- k) **Delete** Schedule F-6 respecting the Near Campus Neighbourhoods Advisory Committee in its entirety.
- l) **Amend** Schedules B-2, B-13, and, B-15 respecting the Kingston Environmental Advisory Forum, Rural Advisory Committee, and Housing and Homelessness Advisory Committee, so as to Add a new section to require the submission of an Annual Report by June 30 each year.
- m) **Amend** Schedule F-3 respecting the Arts Advisory Committee so as to **Replace** the existing Workplans and Annual Report section with a new section to require the submission of an Annual Report by June 30 each year.
- n) **Amend** Schedule B-15 respecting the Housing and Homelessness Advisory Committee so as to **Add** the following after Term of Appointment:
“Meetings:
This Committee will meet quarterly. Additional meetings may be called by the Chair as necessary.”
- o) **Amend** Schedule F-3 so as to revise the Mandate for the Arts Advisory Committee to **Add** the following as a new third paragraph under the heading “Mandate”;
“Maintain close linkages with the Municipal Heritage Committee and its Working Groups to ensure co-ordination of initiatives related to the implementation of the Kingston Culture Plan.”
- p) **Amend** Schedule B-4 respecting the Municipal Heritage Committee (MHC) so as to:
 - i. **Revise** the Composition of the Committee to include: two (2) members of City Council (one to be a member of the Arts, Recreation and Community Policies Committee (appointed annually); the Managing Director of the Kingston Association of Museums, Art Galleries and Historic Sites (KAM); one (1) museum professional appointed by the Board of KAM; one (1) representative of community-based heritage groups; and eight (8) members of the public that represent the full range and diversity of Kingston’s population;
 - ii. **Revise** the Mandate of the new Committee so as to incorporate, with necessary modifications, the existing Mandate of the Museums and Collections Advisory Committee (MACAC) as a new Section 5; and

- iii. **Re-number** the existing Section 5 respecting Working Groups as a new Section 6.
- iv. **Add** a new section following Section 6 to require the submission of an Annual Report by June 30 each year.

- 7. **That** staff be directed to bring forward a report to the Municipal Heritage Committee (MHC) in October/November, 2015 that establishes the mandates and work plans for the following Working Groups (WG): the consolidated MHC Communications and Education WG, MHC Cultural Heritage WG and the Museum and Collections Advisory Committee's (MACAC) Historical Interpretation WG; and the consolidated MACAC Museum Sector WG and MACAC Civic Collections WG; and **That**, once finalized, the two newly formed Working Groups and their respective mandates be presented to Council for authorization and incorporation into the Committee By-law to replace the existing Working Groups in Schedule B-4.
- 8. **That** during the nominations process for appointments to the Municipal Heritage Committee consideration be given to replacing existing members, who reach the maximum six year duration or who's term of appointment expires, with persons with qualifications and experience related to cultural heritage in order to ensure that there is balanced representation on the Committee related to both built heritage and cultural heritage.
- 9. **That** staff be directed to schedule meetings of the Administrative Policies Committee and the Arts, Recreation & Community Policies Committee every two months on a trial basis until November, 2017 at which time the meeting schedule will be re-assessed.

1. Application for Zoning By-Law Amendment 3188 Princess Street - Applicant: McIntosh Perry Consulting

That the application for zoning by-law amendment (File Number D14-128-2015) submitted by McIntosh Perry Consulting, for the property located at 3188 Princess Street, be approved; and

That the Township of Kingston Zoning By-Law Number 76-26, as amended, be further amended as follows:

By **deleting** subsection 20(3)(q) in its entirety and **replacing** it with the following:

“(q) C3-17 (3188 Princess Street)

Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 20 hereof to the contrary, on the lands designated ‘C3-17’ on Schedule ‘A’ hereto, the following regulations shall apply:

- (i) In addition to the uses permitted in Section 20(1)(a) and (b), the following uses shall also be permitted:
 - a retail store; and
 - a business office accessory to a permitted use.
- (ii) An accessory business office shall be restricted to a maximum of 25 percent of the gross floor area of any building or structure occupying the subject property.”; and

Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 5 and Section 13 of this By-Law to the contrary, on the lands zoned 'B.483' on Schedule 'A' attached hereto and known municipally as 440 Brock Street, up to three dwelling units may be developed and the following provisions shall apply:

- a) Maximum number of dwelling units: 3;
- b) Maximum aggregate number of bedrooms: 13;
- c) Maximum number of 3-bedrooms dwelling units: 1;
- d) Maximum number of 5-bedrooms dwelling units: 2;
- e) Minimum front yard setback: 2 metres;
- f) Minimum exterior side yard setback: 0.3 metres;
- g) Minimum side yard setback: 0 metres;
- h) Maximum percentage of lot coverage: 43%;
- i) Minimum amenity area: 15 square metres;
- j) Minimum play space: 0 square metres;
- k) Maximum Density : 91 dwelling units per net hectare; and

That the amending by-law be presented to City Council for all three readings.

Whereas Kingston Partners for a Safe Community (KPSC) is a not-for-profit organization that provides activities and programs aimed at reducing injuries and promoting safety within our community; and
Whereas KPSC delivers its programs and campaigns with support from a national framework for municipalities holding designation as Safe Communities; and
Whereas a safe community designation is a public confirmation of a community's intention to create a safer life for all its citizens; and

Whereas Kingston was designated a Safe Community in 1997 by the former Safe Communities Foundation, one of 65 communities across Canada to hold this designation; and

Whereas in 2012 Safe Communities Canada, together with three other national injury prevention organizations, merged to create Parachute Canada a national charitable organization dedicated to preventing injuries and saving lives; and

Whereas Parachute requires all designated Safe Communities to be re-designated every five years and Kingston has been asked to re-apply for its designation this year; and

Whereas as part of the re-designation as a Safe Community a resolution of Council to endorse the designation and assign a municipal representative to the steering committee is required; and

Whereas the steering committee would meet eight times a year and be comprised of a variety of community representatives including representatives from local government, public health, police, fire, emergency media responders and community partners;

Therefore Be It Resolved That Kingston City Council provide its support to Kingston Partners for a Safe Community in their application for the re-designation of Kingston as a Safe Community; and

That Council authorize a staff member to act as the municipal representative on the local steering committee; and

That an official copy of this motion be provided to Kingston Partners for a Safe Community for use in their application.

Whereas our Council is committed to Transparency and Open Government;

Whereas considerable concern has been expressed by the public regarding approval of this project, including concerns regarding such site plan issues as parking, landscaping, and loss of trees, and

Whereas the delegation of authority by-law allows for Council to "bump up" site plan control applications to Planning Committee; and

Whereas this procedure will allow for further scrutiny of the impact of the development on the neighbouring community;

Therefore Be It Resolved That in the interest of public safety and the desire of many area residents, a by-law be presented to amend By-law 2003-209 "By-Law For Regulating Traffic in the Highways Of The City of Kingston, Subject To The Provisions Of The Highway Traffic Act" as amended, in order to install all-way stop control at the following intersections: 1) Ellesmere Avenue and Crossfield Avenue and 2) Hillendale Avenue and Fairview Road.

Whereas there are approximately 12,000 Kingston residents living under the Low Income Cut Off (LICO) which is \$15,600/year and the average base benefit for an adult receiving Ontario Works is \$656/month (\$7,872/year); and

Whereas the 77% of Kingston residents living under LICO who do not qualify for the Medical Travel and Transportation Benefit or discretionary funds for employment-related travel pay \$46.50 for a monthly, Affordable Transit Pass; and

Whereas the current Affordable Transit Pass offers only a 35% discount and at least 12 comparable cities in Ontario offer discounts of 50% or higher; and

Whereas transportation plays an important role in a resident's ability to improve their economic, social and health outcomes and free or affordable transit are therefore essential to the development of a livable city; and

Whereas free off-peak transit (9:30 am to 3:00 pm) would enable residents living under LICO to access transit regardless of their ability to qualify for special subsidies through social assistance programs, thereby providing a greater number of residents living under LICO with opportunities to travel for employment or social opportunities while maintaining the current levels of provincial subsidy for Kingston Transit;

Therefore Be It Resolved That Council request staff to provide options for a free, off-peak transit pass for residents living under LICO as part of the upcoming Transit Fare Review 2016-2017.
