- 10) **Reaffirmation of an Emergency Approval of an application for 82-84 Brock Street to repair and restore the main level of the facade including stone cleaning, scrapping and painting all the woodwork, installing new thermal pane windows in the main openings, recladding the entrance to 82 Brock Street, filling in the openings in the base stone, finishing the entrance floor with concrete and reinstalling the existing tiles; works at the rear of the building include alterations to the window and opening.**

**THAT** Application P18-082-067-2012EA for the property located at 82-84 Brock Street, to repair and restore the main level of the façade of 82 Brock Street and the doorway to 84 Brock Street. The stone will be cleaned with walnut, corn, baking soda or sandblast method. All woodwork and paint will be scrapped and painted. The main glazed openings will remain the same size they are at present, but will have new thermal pane windows; broken glass in transom windows will be replaced. The entrance door alcove to 82 Brock Street will be reclad in wood tongue and groove panels. The stone will be cleaned and openings in the base stone will be filled in. The entrance floor will be

repoured in concrete and existing tiles will be reinstalled. Various works will be completed to the openings on the rear elevation – one window at the rear of 82 Brock Street will be scraped and painted, a wired glass in a steel frame will be installed on the inside of this window and the second window opening will be filled with glass blocks or framed, insulated and stuccoed grey, **BE REAFFIRMED** in accordance with the details described within a submission filed August 30<sup>th</sup>, 2012 and deemed complete by the Planning and Development Department on September 4<sup>th</sup>, 2012, subject to the following conditions:

1. Should any of the repair activities i.e. scaffolding, dumpsters etc., require use of the City Right Of Way, an encroachment permit will be required. The encroachment permit can be obtained from Brad Morton of the City's Engineering Department.
