**WHEREAS** a number of artists have expressed interest in improving Douglas R. Fluhrer Park in the City of Kingston by doing a work of public art in one of 21 delineated spaces on the retaining wall behind Rideaucrest during the City's Culture Days on Saturday, September 29, 2012; and

**WHEREAS** there is not time for an official request for proposals to invite all the artists of Kingston to participate and to decide which of them should participate; and

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**WHEREAS** an Open Invitational would be open to all artists on a first come first served basis; and

**WHEREAS** inviting artists to do something on that wall would improve the park; and

**WHEREAS** there would be no significant cost to the City of Kingston; and

**WHEREAS** it would not be considered permanent as street art is typically painted over when someone feels they can do better; and

**WHEREAS** City Staff is planning a visioning exercise for Douglas R. Fluhrer Park in 2013 and the art created would serve to suggest possibilities for future sustainable use of the retaining wall,

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Friends of Kingston Inner Harbour be permitted to work in consultation with the Culture Services Department of the City of Kingston to organize an Artists Open Invitational Pilot Project in Douglas R. Fluhrer Park on September 29, 2012 where any Kingston artist who thinks they can do a work of art that will improve the appearance of the retaining wall in Douglas R. Fluhrer Park is invited to come to the park on a first come first served basis on September 29, 2012 (rain date: September 28 or 30, 2012) as part of Culture Days and do a work of art on one of the panels.

**WHEREAS** contraband tobacco has negative public consequences and impacts such as unrestricted youth access to tobacco products and an increase in criminal activity; and

**WHEREAS** contraband tobacco products are easily accessible in our community; and

**WHEREAS** small business are sometimes forced to close because of the sale of contraband tobacco; and

**WHEREAS** small business in our community and government in general stand to benefit from the institution of tougher restrictions on contraband tobacco;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Mayor, on behalf of Kingston City Council, be asked to write a letter to the Ontario Minister of Finance in support of the Ontario Government's most recent budget commitments to eradicate contraband tobacco through the implementation of additional regulatory, enforcement and other provisions in Bill 186 and amendments to the Tobacco Tax Act. Particularly, in support of measures such as:

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- Increased fines for those convicted of offenses related to contraband tobacco;
  - More authority for law enforcement officials with respect to: forfeiture of items seized and impounding of vehicles
  - Drawing on the best practices of other jurisdictions and working collaboratively with the federal government and other jurisdictions to enhance contraband tobacco control through joint enforcement efforts; and

**THAT** the provincial government be encouraged to continue to strengthen their strategies to address the manufacture and supply of contraband tobacco and maintain their commitment to introduce amendments this fall to implement these measures; and

**THAT** municipalities within 100 kilometres of Kingston be made aware of the actions taken by this Council to address the concerns presented by contraband tobacco.

**WHEREAS** the RMC Museum at Point Frederick has only recently been advised that they are eligible for funding from Heritage Canada to help celebrate the War of 1812; and

**WHEREAS** Point Frederick has approximately a dozen sites that demonstrate the importance of the Naval Dockyard in the period, which was critical to the success in the war to the west of Kingston; and

**WHEREAS** the RMC Foundation is applying for funding to establish a self-guided walking tour of Point Frederick that would highlight the importance of the dockyard using the latest technical configuration that provides the widest possible community and public exposure and, most importantly, access; and

**WHEREAS** applicants for funding have been told that indication of community support is required; and

**WHEREAS** completed applications must be received not later than 1 October;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** Kingston City Council authorize the Mayor to write a letter in support of this project which will highlight the rich heritage of Point Frederick associating it with the equally marvelous heritage of the City of Kingston, in a manner that integrates the history of the community and the region for what is clearly a seminal national historical event: the War of 1812.

**WHEREAS** in 2009, the City of Kingston had a plan to assist citizens on Ontario Works to get teeth extractions and dentures; and

**WHEREAS** the 2009 plan assisted Kingston Ontario Works recipients to move into the world or work;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the following motion be considered as part of the 2013 current budget deliberations:

“THAT \$100,000 of municipal funding be allocated to the Ontario Works account, for the specific purpose of providing required dental care and dentures for Kingston Ontario Works recipients with who are having difficulty securing employment because of their bad teeth.”
