c) Tir Nan Óg – St. Patrick’s Day Celebration Temporary Road Closure on Market Street

1) Notice to Update Designation By-Law for 102 Centre Street

WHEREAS Section 29 of the *Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990*, Chapter 0.18 authorizes the Council of a Municipality to enact By-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of cultural heritage value or interest; and,

WHEREAS when the Council of a municipality has appointed a Municipal Heritage Committee, the Council shall, before giving notice of its intention to designate a property, consult with its Municipal Heritage Committee; and,

WHEREAS the property at 102 Centre Street was subject to a Committee of Adjustment decision that changed the legal description of the property; and,

WHEREAS the current reasons for designation are not sufficient under the current requirements of the Ontario Heritage Act; and,

WHEREAS a Heritage Impact Statement was prepared by Bray Heritage, Dr. Jennifer McKendry, and André Scheinman that evaluated the property based on the City's evaluation template and provided an updated statement of significance to be used as the basis of a new Designation By-law;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council serve Notice of Intent to Update the Designation By-law under the Ontario Heritage Act for the property located at 102 Centre Street (Part of Farm Lot 22, Concession 1, City of Kingston, County of Frontenac, being Part 1 on Plan 13R-20257) pursuant to section 30.1 of in accordance with the requirements of the *Ontario Heritage Act*.

1) Power Play Sports – Noise Exemption

THAT the Power Play Centre, located at 820 Gardiners Road, be granted an exemption from the General Noise Prohibition on the use of whistles and buzzers, contained in section 7 of Schedule 'A' of By-Law No. 2004-52, "A By-Law to Regulate Noise", subject to the following conditions:

1. The volume of the buzzer signal shall be kept at a reasonable sound level;
2. The blowing of whistles and sounding of buzzers shall be limited to only what is necessary for the regulation of the hockey games;
3. No blowing of whistles or sounding of buzzers shall occur between 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. (9:00 a.m. on Sundays);
4. Notice will be given two weeks in advance of any tournaments in the following manner:
 - a. Publication on the Power Play Center website;
 - b. Written notices to be provided to abutting neighbours;
 - c. Signage placed at the entrance to the facility.
5. Banging of sticks and banging in the stands will be monitored by the center and by the time keeper and will be kept to a minimum; and

THAT the conditions are for a temporary exemption which will be reviewed over the next 12 months; and

THAT Staff report back to the Administrative Policies Committee in February of 2013, with its findings, including any complaints received regarding the use of whistles and buzzers or any other activities at the facility, and with a recommendation regarding the continuation of the exemption.

2) **Construction of Speed Humps**

This information report provides an opportunity to correct and clarify verbal information provided to Council during budget deliberations at the Committee of the Whole meeting on November 21, 2011. Information was sought from staff regarding the responsibility for costs to rectify speed humps on Rideau Street and Queen Mary Road that were not built to proper specification. A total of 14 speed humps were deemed to be non-satisfactory and required replacement. The costs to reconstruct the 14 speed humps was cost shared between the City and Contractor on a 50/50% basis with the City share of the cost totalling \$25,140.

The following information report provides additional clarification on this matter and steps that the City staff has taken to improve speed hump specifications for future traffic calming projects and tools to assist with quality control and inspection during construction.
