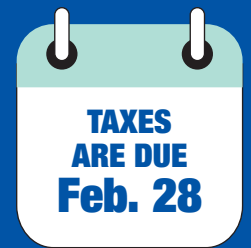

2025 Interim tax bill



How was my 2025 interim tax bill calculated?

Your 2025 interim tax bill is based on 50 per cent of your 2024 annual tax levy. If applicable, past due amounts shown on this tax bill include pre-calculated interest, which is due if your account was not paid in full on or before Jan. 31, 2025. If you made a payment on your account between the billing date (shown in the top right corner of your bill) and Jan. 31, 2025, please call customer service at 613-546-0000 for an updated balance before paying your 2025 interim tax bill.

Payment Options

Payment options are listed on the back of the property tax bill or visit [CityofKingston.ca/Property-Taxes/Paying-Your-Property-Taxes](https://www.cityofkingston.ca/Property-Taxes/Paying-Your-Property-Taxes). You are encouraged to join the **Pre-authorized Payment Plan**. This plan is a convenient, worry-free and secure option to pay property taxes across 10 monthly installments.

Receive Future Tax Bills by Email

With the potential for Canada Post workers to go back on strike in the spring, we recommend registering your property with MyTax. This application will give you easy online access to electronic billings and other tax account information. Visit [MyKingston.ca](https://www.cityofkingston.ca/MyKingston) or scan the QR code below and have your Access Code ready (found on the front of your 2025 Interim Tax Bill) in order to register.

Important note: You are still required to pay your property taxes by the applicable due date, even if you don't receive a property tax bill in the mail. Regular penalties will apply for late payments.



Property tax assistance programs

The City has the following property tax assistance programs for property owners. Please note that ratepayers may need to meet specific criteria.

Tax deferral program (up to \$1,000) and tax increase deferral program for assessment-related increases

Property owners receiving benefits under the Ontario Disability Support Program or the *Ontario Works Act*, or senior citizens receiving the Guaranteed Income Supplement. The deadline to apply for the 2025 tax year is April 30, 2025.

Seniors property tax grant program (\$100)

This program is for senior citizens receiving the Guaranteed Income Supplement. The deadline to apply for the 2025 tax year is April 30, 2025.

Registered charity property tax rebate

This rebate is for registered charities that pay commercial or industrial property taxes for premises they lease or own. The deadline to apply for the 2024 tax year is Feb. 28, 2025.

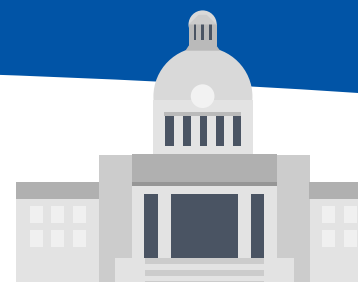
