Kingston votes on Oct. 26, 2026

On Oct. 26, 2026, Kingston will go to the polls to elect its next Mayor, District Councillors, and School Board Trustees.

Lead locally – put your name on the ballot

For those looking to step forward, the nomination period runs from May 1 to 2 p.m. on Aug. 21. To run for municipal office, candidates must be:

- At least 18 years of age
- A Canadian citizen
- Live in Kingston, or own or rent property in Kingston (or be married to someone who does)
- Not legally prohibited from voting or otherwise disqualified by law

Make a plan to vote

On Voting Day, Oct. 26, 2026, voting hours are from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Advance voting will take place on Oct. 16 and 17. Internet voting will be open from Oct. 14 to Oct. 26. To vote easily, make sure your name is on the Voters' List!

Everyone on the Voters' List gets a Voter Information Letter. Your letter tells you where and when to vote, and gives you a voter ID number for online voting. It also lists early voting days and Voting Day details. Bring your Voter Information Letter with you to vote and a piece of ID - it helps things go faster.

Important note: You are responsible for paying your property taxes by the due date, even if a bill is not received by mail. Late payments are subject to regular penalties.

Payment transfer - \$26
To refund an incorrect payment - \$38
Service fee for items returned from bank - \$45
Reprint of tax bill/account statement - \$19

Tax payment receipts

Receipts are available by mail when you enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope with your tax bill payment. You may also present your tax bill to have it stamped "paid" at the Payment Centre.

Assessment and tax appeal information

The province has indicated that property assessments for the 2026 taxation year will continue to be based on the fully phased-in January 1, 2016 current values (i.e., the same valuation date that has been in use since 2020). If you have questions about your property assessment contact the MPAC at 1-866-296-6722 or visit mpac.ca

If your property has undergone changes, you may be eligible to apply for a tax adjustment. For information and applications please go to CityofKingston.ca/Tax. Please note that taxes must be paid even if you are appealing your assessment. The City has no authority to cancel interest beyond the amount of tax reduction achieved if your appeal is successful.

University Hospitals Kingston Foundation, City of Kingston external agencies and County of Frontenac 2026 levies

As per Council direction, the University Hospital Kingston Foundation levy as well as the amounts levied by the City's external agencies and the County of Frontenac for the City's share of Frontenac Paramedic and Fairmount Home for the Aged services will be billed as separate components on the property tax bills.
